

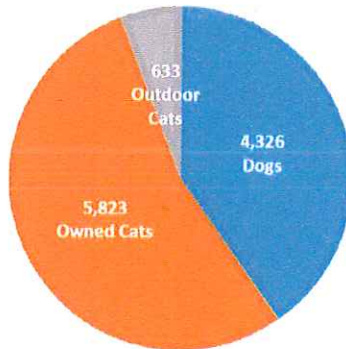

DID YOU KNOW?



If never spayed or neutered, a female dog, her mate, and their puppies could produce over 66,000 dogs in 6 years.

Spaying and neutering can reduce the incidence of some types of cancers, making it likelier for animals to live a longer and healthier life.

Female dogs can become pregnant as early as 5 months of age.

A female dog will go into heat every 5-7 months.

The risk of a dog developing a mammary tumor is 0.5% if spayed before the first heat cycle.
