INSIGHT WITH DR. AMY

Topic: Fleas, Ticks and Tapeworms

Fleas are one of the most common parasites in dogs and cats. They are a nuisance for you and your pets and can cause a variety of skin issues. Because fleas breed throughout the year in our heated homes, it is important to maintain flea control year round.

Also, the most common tapeworms are contracted when fleas are swallowed by pets while grooming.

Signs of a tapeworm infection are small white or brown rice segments under the tail, in your pet's bedding or litter box, or in their feces.

Ticks are common this time of year and cause a number of diseases, including Lyme disease. Tick-transmitted diseases can have devastating effects on pets, including chronic pain, debilitation, paralysis, and, in some cases, even death. Therefore, control and prevention of ticks is extremely important to reduce the risk of tick-transmitted diseases. Always examine your pets for ticks after they come in from outside.

Frontline Plus applied monthly will kill both fleas and ticks. Keeping your pets and homes free of fleas will also prevent them from acquiring tapeworms.

You can get Frontline Plus and tapeworm treatment at UCAN's Friday vaccine clinics from noon to 3:00 p.m. - no appointment necessary. For more information about our vaccine clinics, see our website, www.ucancincinnati.org.
